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Dear CANNDU Council leaders,

Spring is here, which means the end of the fiscal year is just around the corner. Now is the time to make sure you clean out your annual funding before June 1st. In the past, Neighborhood Councils typically spend \$1 million in June, which will not be possible with the new funding deadlines set by the City Clerk in order to switch over to the new funding platform. Hopefully, you have been following your Strategic Budget Plans this year so that you are pacing your Neighborhood Council's spending. We do not have any updates on whether rollover of funds will be available this year so please plan accordingly. We'll be starting our recruiting for the Neighborhood Council [Civic Youth](#) Program this summer. More info below under Field. Mayor Eric Garcetti will be releasing his proposed budget on April 20th so please be sure to weigh in with City Council using Community Impact Statements on budget items. The Neighborhood Council Budget Advocates have released their [white paper](#) on their recommendations so your Neighborhood Council can use them as a reference point. Thanks to the Budget Advocates for all of their hard work!

Citywide Campaign:

Thanks to all the Neighborhood Councils who have submitted Community Impact Statements on [CF 15-1022-S2](#) regarding online voting and the recommended Neighborhood Council structure changes. We've reviewed them and wanted to provide some clarification to some of the comments we've seen: 1. Online voting for Neighborhood Council elections would be offered in addition to a physical polling location. It does not replace the physical polling location. 2. The Department's recommendation to lower the voter age to 16 years old only affects those Neighborhood Councils with 18 years old as their voting age. Some Neighborhood Councils already have those as young as 12 participate, but any Neighborhood Council with younger voter ages than 16 years old would not have to raise them up to 16. The City Council has taken action to move ahead with online voting only for the proposed Skid Row Neighborhood Council Subdivision Election so you still have time to submit a Community Impact Statement on this issue.

Administrative Update:

A friendly reminder that all of the Neighborhood Council's contracts and leases have moved to the Office of the City Clerk. The Department's current Translation and Interpretations contracts with Excel Interpreters, Interpreter Unlimited and Language Line Services have expired. Please do not schedule any new services with these Vendors and please pay any outstanding invoices immediately. For future Translation and Interpretation Services, please contact Continental Interpreting (C-108824) or Language 4 You (C-108077). When scheduling services, please reference the contract number provided and establish your own Neighborhood Council account so that you can be billed directly for payment.

If your Neighborhood Council currently leases office and/or meeting space from a private building, your Lease Agreements will expire at the end of this fiscal year on June 30, 2017. So there is no interruption in service, please place on your Neighborhood Council "Agenda a Motion for "Possible Discussion and Approval" of your Neighborhood Council office and/or meeting space immediately and prior to the end of the fiscal year of June 30, 2017. Funding Updates:

The Office of the [City Clerk Neighborhood Council Funding](#) Team has been holding Round Table discussions in various areas in the City. We're tackling topics of particular interest to Neighborhood Councils, and we are giving you brief presentations on the Online Portal. We have received lots of good questions and positive feedback from the participants with regards to the online portal. We will be visiting additional areas in the City in April and will also present the information at a future Board of Neighborhood Commissioners' Meeting. We'd like to thank all those who participated last week's Neighborhood Council Funding Training. We had an impressive crowd of approximately 40 attendees. Please be reminded that we have some deadlines coming up with respect to funding and because the NC Funding will be transitioning from the current Retail Union Bank Account to a Commercial Union Bank Account, we need to hold these dates firm. **June 1, 2017** - Last day to submit a funding request (FRF) to NC Funding; **June 7, 2017** - Last day to issue a Union Bank Account online check payment; **June 11, 2017** - Last day to use the Neighborhood Council Bank Card.
